

A Parish Meeting was held (according to Notice duly published) in the Parish Room, Willand, on Thursday, April 27th, 1933.

Present:- Mr. W. Rowe (in the Chair), Messrs A. W. Jarrett, W. J. Bavey, Messdames E. Venn and D. W. Thorne, Miss E. Anning, Messrs A. Chick, R. W. Rowe, F. Fouch, Rev. W. Andrews, H. Mortimore, C. Thorne (Clerk to the Parish Council).

Also in attendance Mr. W. Kemp (Sanitary Inspector to the Truroton Rural District Council) and Mr. W. P. Roberts (Assistant).

The Minutes of the last Meeting were read and confirmed.

The Chairman briefly explained the object of the Meeting, viz:-

"To consider a proposed Sewerage Scheme for the Parish of Willand in view of the contemplated building of further houses", and called on Mr. Kemp to explain the proposed Scheme.

Mr. Kemp then explained the Scheme which he said would cost approximately £1300 and intimated that should the Scheme materialize it was the Rural District Council's intention to erect a number of Houses in the Parish (probably not less than 28).

Questions were invited and, after these had been answered, Mr. Honeywill proposed the following resolution (seconded by the Rev. W. Andrews) :-

"That this meeting, having heard the details of a Sewerage Scheme for Willand, will approve same when it has been definitely decided by the Rural District Council to proceed with the erection of additional workmen's dwellings on the site suggested."

Amendments were asked for but as none were forthcoming the resolution was put to the meeting and carried.

A hearty vote of thanks was accorded Mr. Kemp who, in acknowledging, mentioned that he believed a suitable dump for Willand Refuse had been secured near Sampford Turville Hall.
