

March 27th 1958.

A Parish Meeting was held (according to notice duly published) in the Parish Room, Willand, on Thursday, March 27th 1958.

Present:- Mr. R. Salter (in the chair), Mr. E. Rogers (clerk to the Parish Council) and 46 Parishioners.

Minutes.

The Minutes of the last meeting were read and confirmed.

Proposed Sale of Parish Room.

This Room having been valued by a qualified Valuer and duly advertised for sale in the local press in accordance with the Charity Commissioners' instructions, the Parish Council had received offers and decided to sell to the Church at the valuation figure of £300 subject to formal contract and the usual formalities. It was proposed by Miss Parkidge, seconded by Mr. Evans that the Council should rescind their decision until they have taken legal advice. An amendment was put forward by Mr. Barker that the Council when instructing their Solicitors will put the facts of the case, present them with all correspondence and put them in the picture that there has been a little discussion and ask them, if not satisfied, to take Council's opinion. Mr. West seconded.

Voting: Amendment 31. Proposition 7.  
Amendment carried.

Parish Council Accounts.

The audited Financial Statement of the Parish Council for the year ended March 31st 1957 was laid before the Meeting and unanimously approved.

The accounts of the Parochial charities were produced by the Rev. G. A. Heard, examined and approved.

Mr. Evans proposed that the furniture be passed to the Village Hall as the Parish Council uses the Hall with light, heat, etc. without charge. Mrs. Westlake seconded. Mrs. Barnes amended that seats could be bought and placed on the Village Green if the furniture were sold. Mrs. Hawker seconded. Voting: Amendment 22. Proposition 8. Amendment carried.

Mr. West then proposed and it was unanimously agreed that the furniture be offered to the Church for £15 and if they do not want it, it is to be auctioned by Mr. Barker on the premises one evening.

School Path.

Mr. B. W. Baker proposed a further letter be sent to the Devon County Council pointing out that there are about thirty children in the Old Village who are playing in the road as it is necessary to make such a detour to reach the Playing Field since the closure of the School Path, not to mention the children at the gables. Mr. Barker seconded.

Park Street.

Mrs. Barrell proposed that another light be installed in the centre of Park Street & that the road be repaired near the Devon County Council Houses. Mrs. Barnes seconded.
