Rev. K Agnew presented the Accounts of the Willand Community Trust the responsible Officers being unavoidably absent. Monies had been distributed in a number of instances to worthy causes during the current year. The Account was approved.

CHAIRMAN'S
REPORT.

The Chairman, Mrs Godfrey gave the yearly report on the work of the Parish Council. Standards of amenities had been maintained within the Parish ~~and~~ over the past year with minimal headaches. Despite the many new names and reorganization within the Devon County Council and Mid Devon District Council excellent support had been maintained. The Gables Road building complex was advancing rapidly with roads going up and down with regularity, water, electricity and now Gas in Willand. A glorious summer provided Willand with the usual problem, "A new pumping station" with now to

pump, resulting in 6 weeks of water rationing.

Employment was of paramount importance. The Industrial site sparsely covered only with storage units. Extensions planned for the Lloyd Maunders complex will now, with planning approval be advantageous to the problem.

Willand allotments had a bumper year fully occupied, marked only with petty pilfering.

Donations towards the Village Hall Britain Appeal and the visit by German friends of the Willand Square Dance Club were thankfully received by the sponsors.

Special praise was due to the Village Hall Committee who run the Hall so efficiently and still keep its financial commitments off the rates.

A Year of quiet progress for which I must pay tribute for the support of all Councillors ~~and~~ together with the clerk Fred Norwood who has carried out his duties in the manner expected of him, has made the Chairmans work most enjoyable.

Willand is growing rapidly the hand of Welcome is offered to all who move into the area, it is HOME.
